Anyone may address the City Council on any issue within the jurisdiction of the Council. City Council may generally not discuss items that are not specifically identified on the agenda, except in certain circumstances. Therefore, pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.01 (H), action taken as a result of public comment will be limited to directing City staff to study the matter, responding to any criticism, or scheduling the matter for further consideration and decision at a later date. ORDINANCE NO. 25-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HOLBROOK, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE HOLBROOK CODE, CHAPTER 1 CITY **ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE 1-6: – BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.** SECTION 1-6-1 ____ **PLANNING** AND ZONING **COMMISSION:** PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING **ORDINANCES:** PROVIDING FOR **SEVERABILITY;** AND **ESTABLISHING** AN **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the City of Holbrook ("City") is authorized pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes § 9-801, *et seq.*, to, among other things, adopt and enforce a city code and other related codes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has an abiding interest in protecting the public health, safety, and welfare by establishing requirements related to the establishment of the Planning and Zoning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined it is in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 1 – Administration, Article 1.6: – Board and Commissions, Section 1-6-1 – Planning and Zoning Commission; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Holbrook, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1: <u>Amended Code</u>. Chapter 1 – Administration, Article 1.6: – Board and Commissions, Section 1-6-1 – Planning and Zoning Commission of the Holbrook City Code, is hereby amended as follows (deleted text appears in strikeout; new text in <u>ALL CAPS</u>):

CHAPTER 1 – ADMINISTRATION

* * *

ARTICLE 1-6: – BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

1-6-1 - Planning and Zoning Commission

* * *

B. Terms of Office: Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be appointed to staggered, four-year terms. Those office terms begin and expire on October 15, annually. To provide continuity on the board, the first appointments shall be as follows: one (1) member for a one-year term, two (2) members for a two-year term and two (2) members for a three-year term. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for four-year terms. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BEGIN AND END THEIR TERMS ON EVEN NUMBERED YEARS AND THREE MEMBERS SHALL BEGIN AND END TERMS

<u>ON ODD NUMBERED YEARS.</u> Vacancies occurring other than through expiration of the term may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term, or as deemed appropriate by Council.

C. Removal from Office: Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission may be removed from office by a 2/3 majority vote of the Council. <u>A COMMISSIONER MAY</u> <u>BE REMOVED FROM OFFICE BECAUSE THEY MISS A QUARTER OF THE</u> <u>MEETINGS HELD IN A CALENDAR YEAR OR DUE TO THEIR CONDUCT.</u>

D. Compensation: Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall serve without compensation, but they may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses.

E. Non-participating Members: The City Council shall appoint one (1) member of their body to be a non-participating member of the Planning and Zoning Commission. The non-participating designation is to ensure clear representation of Planning and Zoning decisions to the Council sitting as the Board of Adjustments.NON-VOTING MEMBER: THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL APPOINT ONE ADDITIONAL NON-VOTING MEMBER TO THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION. THE NON-VOTING MEMBER SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES INCLUDING MEETING MINUTES AND AGENDAS, AND SHOULD BE A CITY OF HOLBROOK RESIDENT.

G. Organization and Meetings: The commission shall elect from its membership such officers and prescribe their duties as it deems necessary or convenient. The commission shallSHOULD hold at least one (1) regular meeting each month and shallSHOULD adopt such rules as it deems necessary for the transaction of business. The commission shall keep a record of its resolutions, transactions, findings and determinations, all of which shall be open and available at all times for inspection by the public.

H. All members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be residents of the City. If a member ceases to be a resident of the City, the Council may declare the office to be vacant by a majority vote of the Council and <u>THEN</u> the Mayor may appoint a new member with the consent of the Council.

Section 2: <u>Providing for Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances</u>. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference, are hereby repealed.

Section 3: <u>Providing for Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 4: <u>Effective Date</u>. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be 30 days following adoption by the City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HOLBROOK, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE HOLBROOK ZONING CODE, CHAPTER 6 -PLANNING AND ZONING, ARTICLE 6-1 - ZONING ORDINANCE, SECTION 6-1-3 - DEFINITIONS, BY ADDING THE DEFINITIONS "LEGAL PARKING SPACE" AND "MOBILE VENDING UNIT", AND ARTICLE 6-2 - GENERAL REGULATIONS, SECTION 6-2-2 – PARKING, BY ADDING SECTION 6-2-2(L) FOR THE REGULATION OF MOBILE VENDING UNIT PARKING; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES.

WHEREAS, the City of Holbrook ("City") Zoning Ordinance serves to promote the public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City's Planning and Zoning Commission makes recommendations to the City Council on Zoning Ordinance amendments; and

WHEREAS, the City's Planning and Zoning Commission, after holding a public meeting, is recommending amending Chapter 6 - Planning and Zoning, Article 6-1 - Zoning Ordinance, Section 6-1-3 - Definitions, by adding the definitions "Legal Parking Space" and "Mobile Vending Unit", and Article 6-2 - General Regulations, Section 6-2-2 – Parking, by adding Section 6-2-2(L) for the regulation of mobile vending unit parking (the "Amendment"); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens to adopt the Amendment, which promotes public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Holbrook, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1: <u>Amended Zoning Ordinance</u>. Chapter 6 - Planning and Zoning, Article 6-1 - Zoning Ordinance, Section 6-1-3 – Definitions and Article 6-2 - General Regulations, Section 6-2-2 – Parking, are hereby amended as follows (deleted text appears in strikeout; new text <u>underlined</u> and **bolded**):

CHAPTER 6 – PLANNING AND ZONING

ARTICLE 6-1: ZONING ORDINANCE

6-1-3 Definitions

For the purpose of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

LEGAL PARKING SPACE means an area designated for vehicle parking in the City right-of-way that may be paved or unpaved and may be delineated by road surface markings. It does not include a parking space in a parking lot on property owned by the City.

MOBILE VENDING UNIT means a vehicle, trailer, or other portable device used to sell goods or services, and includes, but is not limited to, "mobile food units" and "mobile food vendors" as those terms are defined by A.R.S. § 42-6016.

ARTICLE 6-2: GENERAL REGULATIONS

* * *

6-2-2 Parking

L. Mobile Vending Unit Parking Restrictions

1. A mobile vending unit shall not operate in a parking lot owned by the City but may operate in a legal parking space in the City right-of-way. This restriction does not apply to parking stalls in City owned parking lots that the City has specially designated and marked as mobile vendor parking.

*

- 2. A mobile vending unit, including any semi-permanent structure used or associated with the mobile vending unit, may use no more than one (1) legal parking space. No part of the mobile vending unit shall obstruct adjacent parking spaces unless part of a permitted event.
- 3. If there are no other time restrictions on the use of a legal parking space, a mobile vending unit shall not occupy a legal parking space for more than three (3) hours in a twenty-four (24) hour period. If the mobile vending unit is parked in a legal parking space specially designated and marked by the City for mobile vending units, the mobile vending unit may occupy the parking space for up to six (6) hours in a twenty-four (24) hour period. For

purposes of this subsection, occupy means within one hundred (100) feet of the place in which the mobile vending unit was initially parked.

4. A mobile vending unit shall not claim or attempt to establish any exclusive right to park at a particular street location, unless the parking space is part of a permitted event.

Section 2: <u>Providing for Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances</u>. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference, are hereby repealed.

Section 3: <u>Providing for Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance or any part of the Code adopted herein by reference, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 4: <u>Providing for Penalties</u>. Any person found in violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be responsible under Section 1-1-11 of the City Code for a class one misdemeanor punishable by a fine of no more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5: <u>Effective Date</u>. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be 30 days following adoption by the City Council.

MCAT Activity - 2024

- area. Detectives were able to conduct a traffic stop on the suspect and seized Interdiction Unit, Navajo County Patrol, Show Low PD Patrol and AZDPS suspected in selling and transporting illegal narcotics in the White Mountain • In May, MCAT Detectives with the assistance of Navajo County Criminal GIITEM, investigated an individual living near Show Low Middle School approximately 7300 Fentanyl pills and one weapon.
- The suspect was sentenced to 7 years intense probation.

MCAT Activity - 2024

MCAT Activity - 2024

- civil traffic violations. During the course of the stop, suspicion of criminal activity was observed. In June, the Criminal Interdiction Unit conducted a vehicle stop on I-40 EB near Holbrook for fentanyl pills. The total weight of the pills was 82 pounds, (approximately 371,460 individual pills). The estimated street value of the pills is \$1.8 million dollars. The suspect was arrested K9 Zolton was deployed and alerted, revealing a large suitcase full of counterfeit blue M30 booked into the Navajo County Jail and is currently pending court proceedings.
